Present

Welcome

Ellen O'Gorman, Deputy Director of the Institute for Greece, Rome and the Classical Tradition warmly welcomed participants to the University and the fifth John Addington Symonds Celebration event in collaboration with OutStories Bristol. This is the 178th anniversary of Symonds birth (5th October 1840). He died aged 52 on 19th April 1893.

Election of the board of trustees

Four members were nominated for appointment to the board of trustees: Andy Hole, Charlie Beaton, Cheryl Morgan and Chris Leigh. As the number of nominations did not exceed the maximum of twelve trustees allowed by the new constitution and no objections were raised, the nominees were approved by a single vote.

Talk

Cheryl Morgan introduced the speaker, Aber Regis of the University of Sheffield, where she is senior lecturer in Nineteenth-Century Literature. Dr Regis gave an illustrated talk entitled *John Addington Symonds: from Bristol via Davos to the archive and library*, exploring the fascinating afterlife of Symonds' *Memoirs* (c1899-01) — his account of life as a homosexual man in Victorian Britain and Europe and the subsequent attempts by various relatives and associates to hide and rediscover his legacy. Dr Regis's talk was followed by a question and answer session and concluded with expressions of warm appreciation for the informative, engaging and entertaining delivery.
